DEFINING TERMS

- Reproductive Justice SisterSong defines Reproductive Justice as the human right to maintain personal bodily autonomy, have children, not have children, and parent the children we have in safe and sustainable communities.
- Gender Diversity an umbrella term that is used to describe gender identities that demonstrate a diversity of expression beyond the binary framework.
- Identity the qualities, beliefs, etc. that make a particular person or group different from others. (i.e.: race, gender, etc.)
- Radical Inclusion "the intentional inclusion of all persons; especially people who have traditionally lived at the margins of society," as defined by a group called RoC Fellowship.

ISSUE IMPACT

- The Reproductive Justice movement has many intersections. In order to build momentum within the reproductive movement, there must be an understanding of where discrimination and privilege can exist among the combination of a person's political and social identities.
- **Discriminatory and punitive policy** directly infringes upon the reproductive rights of all people. Policy reformation is a popular solution to addressing issues impacting reproductive justice.









- Reproductive rights are human rights. Utilizing the universally accepted human rights framework coined by the United Nations, the reproductive justice movement is directly connected to human rights.
- The reproductive justice movement is a framework that includes all individuals, regardless of how they identify, as it works to protect their reproductive rights.

INTERSECTIONAL SOLUTIONS

- Reproductive Justice spaces must address issues equitably, foster radical inclusivity, and uplift gender and racial diversity.
- Access to resources, such as gender expansive and inclusive healthcare, is key. Without adequate access to resources, many birthing people's reproductive rights are being infringed upon.
- Reproductive rights/iustice organizations must support and advocate for their workers as they do their constituents. Reproductive justice organizations within the US are unionizing swiftly and demanding equitable, inclusive, and safe workplaces.
- Reproductive justice is interconnected to all justice movements; an intersectional framework is the best solution for navigating and building momentum in the movement.
